MAC Virtual Founders Day 2021

The Montgomery Alumni Chapter (MAC) celebrated the 110th founding of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity Inc., and the 72nd founding of our beloved Montgomery Alumni Chapter during the month of January 2021. This year's celebration featured an open Founder's Day and Awards Program. Each year The MAC alternates between an open program and a formal closed program.

The month began with the 110th observance of the birth of the fraternity on January 5th. The "J5" celebration was virtual and included a visit from the 10th Southern Province Polemarch, Bertram K. Orum. Brother Dr. Ralph J. Bryson celebrated his 75th year in the frat and gave a brief history of the founders. Brothers from every decade, beginning with the 1940's all the way through 2020, gave a shout out to all those in attendance at the virtual gathering.



The MAC completed several community service projects as part of the month-long observance. The first was on January 16th. The MAC joined with the Guide Right Kappa League for the MLK Day of Service at Cleveland Ave. YMCA. Our group was assigned a designated area of the community to clear debris and pick-up trash. 





Among our purposes are:


- •To serve as an auxiliary to Montgomery Alumni Kappas,
